The following list of those leaving the Soviet Union as part of Transport #2 in 1924 was found in the Mennonite Heritage Archives (Winnipeg, Manitoba). It is one of several original lists from the 1920s and is part of the David A. Lepp (Saskatoon) collection. Lepp was the co-ordinator of Transport #2. There is much more on these people in MHA Vol.4422 file 2, as well as in the MHA extensive collection of Canadian Mennonite Board of Colonization records.

Note 1: Names and locations were written in Russian and converted into more recognizable forms after translation.

Note 2: The meaning of the word Echelon is unclear.

Instructions for the train and wagon masters.

1. each train shall elect a trainmaster and two assistants, and each wagon shall elect a wagonmaster and an assistant.
2. the trainmaster shall be the official representative of the migrants in the squadron, shall maintain order and shall be personally responsible for any breach of the railway's regulations.
3. the wagon master shall also be liable for any disturbance of order on the railway by persons travelling in his wagon.
4. in the event of infringement of the regulations issued by the People's Commissariat for Railway Transport, both the train driver and the wagon master may be prosecuted by the railway authorities and removed from the train and placed under arrest.
5. the rules for passengers established by the railways shall be posted in conspicuous places in all stations so that every passenger can acquaint himself with them.
6. when travelling in a train, passengers shall observe the following:
 - (a) When a train enters a station, one of the assistant conductors and wagonmasters or their assistants shall remain with the train to keep order and give explanations to the officials, and the conductor or his second assistant shall report the arrival of the train to the station-master and ask him when the train can be dispatched.
 - b) Once the train has arrived at the station, people are not allowed to leave the carriages until the conductor has given permission.
 - c) It is not allowed to walk aimlessly on the tracks of the station.
 - d) Campfires and samovars may only be lit in the area designated by the stationmaster. The train driver must ask the stationmaster or the stationmaster on duty at each station about this and only then pass on the permission received to his men.
 - e) It is not permitted to heat samovars or light a primus in the wagons while the train is in motion, whether stationary or in motion.

- f) It is not permitted to soil the tracks on a siding and the cleaning of the wagons must be done during the journey between stations, but never in the station itself.
- g) In order to avoid accidents involving persons, it is absolutely forbidden to stand under the wagons or sit on leaning ladders at the stops.
- h) A strict instruction should be given to everyone on the train not to leave children unattended for a minute, as most accidents on the railway involve children.
- i) People should not be allowed to stretch their legs out of the hatch while sitting on the floor when the train is running and there should be a partition on the door to prevent children from falling out of it.
- j) Under no circumstances should persons sit on the tracks or on the edge of the platform at a stop, with their feet on the tracks.
- k) Persons may only walk next to the tracks near their train or on the platform.
- l) When crossing the tracks, take care not to be hit by a passing locomotive, shunting train or train.
- m) Do not allow children to ride on the platform with shunting trains or touch track equipment such as points, lights, signal boxes and telegraph wires.

These instructions are to be signed by the train driver and wagon master and his assistants and read to the emigrants in each wagon. If an emigrant wilfully violates the above instructions, the conductor has the right to eject the culprit from the train and, in serious cases, to hand him over to the railway authorities for prosecution.
